The Associate in Arts (AA) degree is designed for students who plan to transfer to four-year colleges and universities with majors in the Humanities, Social Sciences, and Business. The degree will transfer as a block to North Carolina public universities and other institutions which participate in the Comprehensive Articulation Agreement (CAA). Electives should be selected based on the intended major. Electives must be chosen from transferrable coursework.
