Early Childhood Education

Early Childhood Education (A55220AS) Degree Awarded

The Associate in Applied Science degree in Early Childhood Education is awarded by the college upon completing this program.

The Early Childhood program has three degree tracks:

- 1. Professional Degree (A55220AS)
- 2. Transfer Teacher Licensure Degree (A55220BK)
- 3. Transfer Non-Licensure Degree (A55220NL)

Each of these degree tracks prepares students to work in early care and education programs with children ages 0-5 as lead teachers. Students completing the Teacher Transfer degree are additionally prepared to transfer to a 4-year program to complete a BA degree and receive Birth-Kindergarten licensure, which allows them to be a Lead Teacher in a public Pre-K classroom or enter the public school system as a Kindergarten teacher. Students completing the Non-licensure track are additionally prepared to transfer to a 4-year program to complete a BA that does not include teacher licensure.

Admissions

- 1. Submit proof of high school graduation or equivalency.
- 2. Complete an admissions application to Central Piedmont.
- Complete or waive placement tests. Students with appropriate transcripts or official score reports can waive placement testing by meeting with a Central Piedmont academic advisor.
- Consult with an academic advisor to declare program goals/major and contact the Early Childhood Education Program Advisor.
- 5. Consult with an assigned Early Childhood Program Advisor about the next steps.

Program Accreditation

The Early Childhood Education Associate Degree program at Central Piedmont is accredited by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC).

State Credentials

All Early Childhood courses may be applied for training/education hours required by the North Carolina Division of Child Development and Early Education (NCDCDEE). Courses are offered for North Carolina Early Childhood, School-Age and Administrative Credentials.

Four-Year Articulation Agreements
